#### Overview

CUREDD (Charity for Under-heated Residents & Energy by Dwelling Doctors) is a registered charity supporting households affected by fuel poverty. Its work addresses the financial barriers that prevent residents from adequately heating their homes – a key contributing factor to recurring damp, mould and health risks.

#### Alignment to housing sector priorities

CUREDD's activities align directly with:

- Damp, mould and condensation prevention
- Resident health and wellbeing
- Awaab's Law compliance outcomes
- Sustainable housing management
- Reduction of repeat defects and call-backs

#### Proposed social value activities

Through partnership with CUREDD, the contractor will support the following initiatives:

1. Emergency energy support
  - Funding emergency prepayment meter top-ups for vulnerable households
  - Preventing loss of heating and hot water during crisis periods
2. Crisis heating provision
  - Short-term financial assistance to enable safe heating in under-heated homes
  - Reducing immediate health risks and safeguarding concerns
3. Resident education & guidance
  - Practical advice on safe and affordable heating use
  - Guidance on managing energy costs and reducing debt
  - Support to reduce behaviours that contribute to condensation and mould

- Residents living in properties undergoing damp, mould or ventilation works
